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Lehi predicts that the Jews will be taken captive by the Babylonians—He tells of the coming among the Jews of a Messiah, a Savior, a Redeemer—Lehi tells also of the coming of the one who should baptize the Lamb of God—Lehi tells of the death and resurrection of the Messiah—He compares the scattering and gathering of Israel to an olive tree—Nephi speaks of the Son of God, of the gift of the Holy Ghost, and of the need for righteousness. About 600–592 B.C.

AND now I, Nephi, proceed to give an account upon athese plates of my proceedings, and my reign and ministry; wherefore, to proceed with mine account, I must speak somewhat of the things of my father, and also of my brethren.

2 For behold, it came to pass after my father had made an end of speaking the words of his adream, and also of exhorting them to all diligence, he spake unto them concerning the Jews—

3 That after they should be destroyed, even that great city "Jerusalem, and many be bcarried away captive into Babylon, according to the own due time of the Lord, they should return again, yea, even be brought back out of captivity; and after they should be brought back out of captivity they should possess again the land of their inheritance.

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5 And he also spake concerning the prophets, how great a number had "testified of these things, concerning this Messiah, of whom he had spoken, or this Redeemer of the world.

6 Wherefore, all mankind were in a alost and in a bfallen state, and ever would be save they should rely on this Redeemer.

7 And he spake also concerning a aprophet who should come before the Messiah, to prepare the way of the Lord—

8 Yea, even he should go forth and cry in the wilderness: "Prepare ye the way of the Lord, and make his paths straight; for there standeth one among you whom ye know not; and he is mightier than I, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to unloose. And much spake my father concerning this thing.

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10 And after he had baptized the Messiah with water, he should behold and bear record that he had baptized the "Lamb of God, who should take away the sins of the world.

11 And it came to pass after my father had spoken these words he spake unto my brethren concerning the gospel which should be preached among the Jews, and also concerning the "dwindling of the Jews in bunbelief. And after they had "slain the Messiah, who should come, and after he had been slain he should "rise from the dead, and should make himself "manifest, by the Holy Ghost, unto the Gentiles."

12 Yea, even my father spake much concerning the Gentiles, and also concerning the house of Israel, that they should be compared like unto an "olive tree, whose branches should be broken off and should be "scattered upon all the face of the earth.

13 Wherefore, he said it must needs be that we should be led with one accord into the "land of promise, unto the fulfilling of the word of the Lord, that we should be scattered upon all the face of the earth.

14 And after the house of alsrael should be scattered they should be bathered together again; or, in fine, after the Gentiles had received the fulness of the Gospel, the natural branches of the olive tree, or the remnants of the house of slsrael, should be grafted in, or come to the knowledge of the true Messiah, their Lord and their Redeemer.

15 And after this manner of language did my father prophesy and speak unto my brethren, and also many more things which I do not write in this book; for I have written as many of them as were expedient for me in mine aother book.

16 And all these things, of which I have spoken, were done as my father dwelt in a atent, in the valley of Lemuel.

17 And it came to pass after I, Nephi, having heard all the "words of my father, concerning the things which he saw in a by vision, and also the things which he spake by the power of the Holy Ghost, which power he received by faith on the Son of God—and the Son of God was the "Messiah who should come—I. 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
"Some have sincere faith in the existence of a God but not necessarily in a revealing and omniscient God. Other sincere individuals question God's omniscience, wondering, even though respectfully, whether even God can know the future. But an omniscient and revealing God can at any present moment disclose things future. This is possible because 'in the presence of God, ... all things for their glory are manifest, past, present, and future, and are continually before the Lord' (D&C 130:7). Thus God 'knoweth all things, for all things are present before [his] eyes' (D&C 38:2). He told Moses, 'There is no God beside me, and all things are present with me, for I know them all' (Moses 1:6).

"No qualifiers on the scope of God's knowledge appear in holy writ. Instead, we read: 'O how great the holiness of our God! For he knoweth all things, and there is not anything save he knows it.' (2 Nephi 9:20.)"





"Why was Israel scattered? The answer is clear; it is plain; of it there is no doubt.
