



# Scripture GENIS




In Pennsylvania, Joseph and Martin labored together on the translation until 14 June 1828. By that time the translation filled 116 foolscap pages (roughly legal-size), and Martin asked if he could take this manuscript home to show his wife and friends.

Lucy Harris, Martin's wife, became increasingly concerned about Martin's interest and financial involvement in the translation of the plates. She and others began to press Martin for evidence of the plates' existence.






He hoped this would convince Lucy that the work was legitimate and stop her opposition. Through the Urim and Thummim, Joseph inquired of the Lord. The answer was no. Martin, not satisfied, persisted until Joseph again asked the Lord; still the answer was no. Martin's pleadings and solicitations continued. Joseph wanted to satisfy his benefactor. He was young and inexperienced, and he relied upon the age and maturity of Martin. Moreover, Martin was the only one Joseph knew who was willing to work as scribe and finance the publication of the book. These considerations moved him to ask again. Finally, the Lord granted a conditional permission. Martin agreed in writing to show the manuscript to only four or five people, including his wife; his brother; his father; his mother; and Lucy's sister. Martin then left for Palmyra with the only copy of the manuscript.






Shortly after Martin's departure, Emma Smith bore a son, Alvin, who died the day he was born. Emma nearly died herself, and for two weeks Joseph was constantly at her bedside. When she improved, his attention returned to the manuscript. By this time Martin had been gone for three weeks, and they had heard nothing from him. Martin had not been totally irresponsible. He had spent time with his wife, taken care of business in Palmyra, and served on a jury.

Emma, expressing her concern about the manuscript, encouraged Joseph to catch a stage to Palmyra and check on the matter. After traveling from Harmony to the Palmyra area and walking the last twenty miles during the night, Joseph finally arrived at his parents' home in Manchester. He immediately sent for Martin. Martin usually came quickly, so breakfast was prepared for him and the Smiths. Several hours

He climbed on the fence and sat there with his hat down over his eyes. Finally he came in and sat down at the breakfast table, but he could not eat. Lucy Mack Smith, the Prophet's mother, recorded: "He took up his knife and fork as if he were going to use them, but immediately dropped them. Hyrum, observing this, said 'Martin, why do you not eat; are you sick?' Upon which Mr. Harris pressed his hands upon his temples, and cried out in a tone of deep anguish, 'Oh, I have lost my soul! I have lost my soul!'






"Joseph who had not expressed his fears till now, sprang from the table, exclaiming, 'Martin, have you lost that manuscript? Have you broken your oath, and brought down condemnation upon my head as well as your own?'

"Yes; it is gone,' replied Martin, 'and I know not where."

Self-condemnation and fear beset the Prophet. He exclaimed, "'All is lost! all is lost! What shall I do? I have sinned—it is I who tempted the wrath of God. I should have been satisfied with the first answer which I received from the Lord; for he told me that it was not safe to let the writing go out of my possession.' He wept and groaned, and walked the floor continually.






"At length he told Martin to go back and search again.

"No'; said Martin, 'it is all in vain; for I have ripped open beds and pillows [looking for the manuscript]; and I know it is not there.'

"Then must I,' said Joseph, 'return with such a tale as this? I dare not do it. And how shall I appear before the Lord? Of what rebuke am I not worthy from the angel of the Most High?' ...

"The next morning, he set out for home. We parted with heavy hearts, for it now appeared that all which we had so fondly anticipated, and which had been the source of so much secret gratification, had in a moment fled, and fled forever."








In words written to his mother he declared,






When Joseph returned to Harmony in the summer of 1828, Moroni appeared to him again and took the plates away. "If you are sufficiently humble and penitent," the angel said, "you will receive them again on the twenty-second of September."

# (Revelations in Context, "The Contributions of Martin Harris")

The angel appeared and gave again to Joseph the Urim and Thummim, or interpreters, that Joseph had originally received with the plates but had lost for having "wearied the Lord in asking that Martin Harris might take the writings." Using the Urim and Thummim, Joseph received the earliest of his revelations for which a text survives.

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

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

### **SECTION 3**

Revelation given to Joseph Smith the Prophet, at Harmony, Pennsylvania, July 1828, relating to the loss of 116 pages of manuscript translated from the first part of the Book of Mormon, which was called the book of Lehi. The Prophet had reluctantly allowed these pages to pass from his custody to that of Martin Harris, who had served for a brief period as scribe in the translation of the Book of Mormon. The revelation was given through the Urim and Thummim. (See section 10.)

1-4, The Lord's course is one eternal round; 5-15, Joseph Smith must repent or lose the gift to translate; 16-20, The Book of Mormon comes forth to save the seed of Lehi.

THE <sup>a</sup>works, and the designs, and the purposes of God cannot be <sup>b</sup>frustrated, neither can they come to naught.

2 For God doth not <sup>a</sup> walk in crooked paths, neither doth he <sup>b</sup> turn to the right hand nor to the left, neither doth he vary from that which he hath said, therefore his paths are straight, and his <sup>c</sup> course is one eternal round.

3 Remember, remember that it is

not the <sup>a</sup>work of God that is frustrated, but the work of men;

4 For although a man may have many arevelations, and have bower to do many mighty works, yet if he boasts in his own strength, and sets at naught the counsels of God, and follows after the dictates of his own will and formal desires, he must fall and incur the gvengeance of a hjust God upon him.

5 Behold, you have been <sup>a</sup>entrusted with these things, but how strict were your commandments; and remember also the promises which were made to you, if you did not transgress them.

6 And behold, how a oft you have

btransgressed the commandments and the laws of God, and have gone on in the persuasions of men.

7 For, behold, you should not have <sup>a</sup>feared man more than God. Although men set at naught the counsels of God, and <sup>b</sup>despise his words—

8 Yet you should have been faithful; and he would have extended his arm and <sup>a</sup> supported you against all the fiery <sup>b</sup> darts of the <sup>c</sup> adversary; and he would have been with you in every time of <sup>d</sup> trouble.

9 Behold, thou art Joseph, and thou wast chosen to do the work of the Lord, but because of transgression, if thou art not aware thou wilt <sup>a</sup>fall.

10 But remember, God is merciful; therefore, repent of that which thou hast done which is contrary to the commandment which I gave you, and thou art still chosen, and art <sup>a</sup>again called to the work;

11 Except thou <sup>a</sup>do this, thou shalt be delivered up and become as other men, and have no more gift.

12 And when thou deliveredst up that which God had given thee sight and power to atranslate, thou deliveredst up that which was bacred into the hands of a wicked man,

13 Who has set at naught the counsels of God, and has broken the most

sacred promises which were made before God, and has depended upon his own judgment and <sup>a</sup>boasted in his own wisdom.

14 And this is the reason that thou hast lost thy privileges for a season—

15 For thou hast suffered the counsel of thy <sup>a</sup>director to be trampled upon from the beginning.

16 Nevertheless, my awork shall go forth, for inasmuch as the knowledge of a Savior has come unto the world, through the testimony of the Jews, even so shall the knowledge of a Savior come unto my people—

17 And to the <sup>a</sup>Nephites, and the Jacobites, and the Josephites, and the Zoramites, through the testimony of their fathers—

18 Ånd this atestimony shall come to the knowledge of the bLamanites, and the Lemuelites, and the Ishmaelites, who cdwindled in unbelief because of the diniquity of their fathers, whom the Lord has suffered to destroy their brethren the Nephites, because of their finiquities and their abominations.

19 And for this very <sup>a</sup>purpose are these <sup>b</sup>plates <sup>c</sup>preserved, which contain these records—that the <sup>d</sup>promises of the Lord might be fulfilled, which he made to his <sup>e</sup>people;

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During his visit to his son in Harmony, Joseph Smith Sr. asked for a revelation concerning his own role in the Restoration; the young prophet thus received one of his earliest revelations for another individual. When the revelation was later copied in preparation for publication, the following heading was added: "A Revelation to Joseph the Father of the Seer he desired to know what the Lord had for him to do & this is what he Received as follows."

"it contains sufficient counsel and instruction for a lifetime of study. No one has yet mastered it. It was not intended as a personal revelation to Joseph Smith, but to be of benefit to all who desire to embark in the service of God. It is a revelation to each member of the Church, especially to all who hold the Priesthood. Perhaps there is no other revelation in all our scriptures that embodies greater instruction pertaining to the manner of qualification of members of the Church for the service of God, and in such condensed form than this revelation. 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

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### SECTION 5

Revelation given through Joseph Smith the Prophet, at Harmony, Pennsylvania, March 1829, at the request of Martin Harris.

1–10, This generation will receive the Lord's word through Joseph Smith; 11–18, Three witnesses will testify of the Book of Mormon; 19–20, The word of the Lord will be verified as in previous times; 21–35, Martin Harris may repent and be one of the witnesses.

BEHOLD, I say unto you, that as my servant <sup>a</sup>Martin Harris has desired a witness at my hand, that you, my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., have got the plates of which you have testified and borne record that you have received of me;

2 And now, behold, this shall you say unto him—he who spake unto you, said unto you: I, the Lord, am God, and have given these things unto you, my servant Joseph Smith, Jun., and have commanded you that you should stand as a awitness of these things;

3 And I have caused you that you should enter into a acovenant with me, that you should not be show them except to those cpersons to whom I commanded you; and you have no <sup>d</sup>power over them except I grant it unto you.

"This revelation declared that this generation shall have the word of the Lord through Joseph Smith. There may be some who think that this is unreasonable, and the Lord should use some miraculous means to convert the world... When they are informed that the angel took the plates back again, they turn away in their skepticism, shaking their heads. 32 And now, because I foresee the lying in wait to destroy thee, yea, I foresee that if my servant Martin Harris humbleth not himself and receive a witness from my hand, that he will fall into atransgression;

33 And there are many that lie in wait to <sup>a</sup>destroy thee from off the face of the earth; and for this cause, that thy days may be bprolonged, I have given unto thee these commandments.

### SECTION 6

Revelation given to Joseph Smith the Prophet and Oliver Cowdery, at Harmony, Pennsylvania, April 1829. Oliver Cowdery began his labors as scribe in the translation of the Book of Mormon, April 7, 1829. He had already received a divine manifestation of the truth of the Prophet's testimony respecting the plates on which was engraved the Book of Mormon record. The Prophet inquired of the Lord through the Urim and Thummim and received this response.
