




D&C 45 - The Episode





(Doctrine and Covenants Contexts: Section 45 by Steven C. Harper, Book of Mormon Central)

"Joseph Smith bought a King James Version of the Bible at Egbert Grandin's Palmyra, New York, bookstore while the Book of Mormon was being printed upstairs. Shortly after the Church was restored in 1830, Joseph's main task became revising this Bible. He called the revision his new translation. He began with Genesis and received by revelation much restored scripture, including the Book of Moses that is now in the Pearl of Great Price.

The Book of Moses explains how Enoch led his people to unitedly eliminate poverty and live with one heart and one mind "in process of time" (Moses 7:21). One imagines that by March

The Book of Moses explains how Enoch led his people to unitedly eliminate poverty and live with one heart and one mind "in process of time" (Moses 7:21). One imagines that by March 1831 Joseph was slogging through less compelling parts of the Old Testament, trying to stay awake while reading about who begat whom and so on and so forth. Joseph's history says,

'False reports, lies, and fo[o]lish stories were published in the newspapers, and circulated in every direction, to prevent people from investigating the work, or embracing the faith. . . . But to the joy of the saints who had to struggle against every thing that prejudice and wickedness could invent, I received the following, referring to section 45."

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## SECTION 45

Revelation given through Joseph Smith the Prophet to the Church, at Kirtland, Ohio, March 7, 1831. Prefacing the record of this revelation, Joseph Smith's history states that "at this age of the Church . . . many false reports . . . and foolish stories, were published . . . and circulated, . . . to prevent people from investigating the work, or embracing the faith.... But to the joy of the Saints, . . . I received the following."

1-5, Christ is our advocate with the Father; 6-10, The gospel is a messenger to prepare the way before the Lord; 11–15, Enoch and his brethren were received by the Lord unto Himself; 16-23, Christ revealed signs of His coming as given on the Mount of Olives; 24–38, The gospel will be restored, the times of the Gentiles will be fulfilled, and a desolating sickness will cover the land; 39–47, Signs, wonders, and the Resurrection are to attend the Second Coming; 48–53, Christ will stand on the Mount of Olives, and the Jews will see the wounds in His hands and feet; 54–59, The Lord will reign during the Millennium; 60-62, The Prophet is instructed to begin the translation of the New Testament, through which

important information will be made known; 63–75, The Saints are commanded to gather and build the New Jerusalem, to which people from all nations will come.

HEARKEN, O ye people of my <sup>a</sup>church, to whom the <sup>b</sup>kingdom has been given; hearken ye and give ear to him who laid the foundation of the earth, who <sup>c</sup>made the heavens and all the dhosts thereof, and by whom all things were made which elive, and move, and have a being.

2 And again I say, hearken unto my voice, lest <sup>a</sup>death shall overtake you; in an bhour when ye think not the summer shall be past, and the **DOCTRINE AND COVENANTS 45:3–16** 

charvest ended, and your souls not saved.

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

Section 45 is an unusual revelation. It is a commentary on one of the most complicated and even contested passages of the Bible. That's not remarkable. There is no shortage of interpreters of Jesus's Olivet discourse. The remarkable thing is that the interpreter in section 45 is the Savior himself. This is the finest text in the world for understanding Matthew 24, Mark 13, and Luke 21. One could go to any number of commentaries on Matthew 24 and find all kinds of analysis. These would be helpful, perhaps, but section 45 is the only source on earth in which the Savior of the world interprets and applies his own Olivet discourse.

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Section 45 cements a connection between the Old Testament, New Testament, and the restoration of the gospel through Joseph Smith. The Savior who reveals it is the "God of Enoch," about whom Joseph has recently learned so much in his revision of Genesis and reception of the Book of Moses. The Savior gave the discourse to his disciples on the Mount of Olives, and here he is in Section 45 interpreting and applying it to the Latter-day Saints.

Section 45 laces together the dispensations of Enoch, the Savior and his apostles, and the fullness of times. Overwhelming wickedness and pending calamities are common themes in each. Always the outnumbered righteous seek safety, peace, and refuge. They seek Zion. Section 45 gives coherence to the past, present, and future. One sees in it the Lord's plans and purposes being accomplished.

At the point of highest tension in the Savior's discourse, just as he is explaining to the apostles about the extreme wickedness, violence, and calamities that are coming, he interjects to say that at that point the apostles "were troubled." Then he restores part of the sermon missing from the Bible, a part that makes sense of all the rest: "I said unto them: Be not troubled, for, when all these things shall come to pass, ye may know that the promises which have been made unto you shall be fulfilled" (D&C 45:34-35). Without revelations like this one, the world might seem like a violent, purposeless mess. With it, one need not be troubled, for one can see that Zion rises in contrast to the world and that calamities portend the fulfillment of Christ's promises that Zion is about to be established.


I don't think there is anyone, especially among those with tender hearts, who doesn't feel sad for the foolish young women. And some of us just want to say to the others, "Can't you just share so everyone can be happy?" But think about it. This is a story the Savior told, and He is the one who calls five of them "wise" and five of them "foolish."

As we consider this parable as a pattern for temple preparation, consider the words of a latter-day prophet who taught that "the oil of spiritual preparedness cannot be shared." President Spencer W. Kimball helped clarify why the five "wise" young women could not share the oil in their lamps with those who were "foolish" when he said: "Attendance





Kimball helped clarify why the five "wise" young women could not share the oil in their lamps with those who were "foolish" when he said: "Attendance at sacrament meetings adds oil to our lamps, drop by drop over the years. Fasting, family prayer, home teaching, control of bodily appetites, preaching the gospel, studying the scriptures—each act of dedication and obedience is a drop added to our store. Deeds of kindness, payment of offerings and tithes, chaste thoughts and actions ... -these, too, contribute importantly to the oil with which we can at midnight refuel our exhausted lamps."

Can you see the pattern of preparedness—drop by drop—that can help us as we think how we might be more diligent in our preparation to receive sacred ordinances for ourselves and others? What other small and simple things might we do to add precious spiritual drops of oil to our lamps of preparation?



"Taking 'the Holy Spirit for [our] guide' (D&C 45:57) is possible and is essential for our spiritual growth and survival in an increasingly wicked world. Sometimes as Latter-day Saints we talk and act as though recognizing the influence of the Holy Ghost in our lives is the rare or exceptional event. We should remember, however, that the covenant promise is that we may always have His Spirit to be with us. This supernal blessing applies to every single member of the Church who has been baptized, confirmed, and instructed to 'receive the Holy Ghost'"

"Page 1 of the manuscript is dated March 8th 1831, followed by the notation 'A Translation of the New Testament translated by the power of God.' This comment shows how the brethren felt about the work they were doing"

Sometimes the word refers to the people of Zion and describes them as "the pure in heart" (D&C 97:21). **Elsewhere Zion refers** to the entire Church and its stakes all over the world (see D&C 82:14). The word **Zion** can also refer to specific geographic locations. In this revelation, Zion referred to a physical city that the Saints would establish and gather to.




