The term Beelzebub used by the Pharisees (see Matthew 12:24) literally means "Lord of flies." It refers to an ancient Phoenician deity who was a chief among demons. In scripture, Beelzebub is another name for Satan.

The Prophet Joseph Smith explained how someone commits the sin of blasphemy against the Holy Ghost:

"He must receive the Holy Ghost, have the heavens opened unto him, and know God, and then sin against him. After a man has sinned against the Holy Ghost, there is no repentance for him. He has got to say that the sun does not shine while he sees it; he has got to deny Jesus Christ when the heavens have been opened unto him, and to deny the plan of salvation with his eyes open to the truth of it; and from that time he begins to be an enemy" (in History of the Church, 6:314).

Blasphemy Against or Denying the Holy Ghost

President Spencer W. Kimball taught:

"The sin against the Holy Ghost requires such knowledge that it is manifestly impossible for the rank and file to commit such a sin."

(The Miracle of Forgiveness [1969], 123).

Blasphemy Against or Denying the Holy Ghost

Elder James E. Talmage of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles explained why Jesus was warning the Pharisees of the unpardonable sin in Matthew 12:31–32:

"Jesus was merciful in His assurance that words spoken against Himself as a Man, might be forgiven; but to speak against the authority He possessed, and particularly to ascribe that power and authority to Satan, was very near to blasphemy against the Holy Ghost, for which sin there could be no forgiveness."

(Jesus the Christ, 3rd ed. [1916], 269).

The Pharisees took an untenable position when they accused Jesus of using the power of the devil to do something good by healing a man possessed with a devil (see Matthew 12:22-24). The Savior taught that "a good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit" (Matthew 7:18). In challenging the Pharisees to "either make the tree good, and his fruit good; or else make the tree corrupt, and his fruit corrupt" (Matthew 12:33), Jesus was telling them they needed to make a choice about Him. Because of His good works they could not consistently call Him evil, and they could not take a neutral position (see Matthew 12:30). Confronted with His testimony and good works, the Pharisees had to choose whether or not they would accept Him as the Christ and follow Him.

32 And likewise a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked *on him*, and passed by on the other side.

33 But a certain ^aSamaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had ^bcompassion on him,

34 And went to him, and bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine, and set him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn, and took ^acare of him.

35 And on the morrow when he departed, he took out two pence, and gave *them* to the ^ahost, and said unto him, Take care of him; and whatsoever thou spendest more, when I come again, I will repay thee.

36 Which now of these three, thinkest thou, was neighbour unto him that fell among the thieves?

37 And he said, He that shewed mercy on him. Then said Jesus unto him, Go, and do thou likewise.

38 ¶ Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named ^aMartha received him into her house.

39 And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word.

40 But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me.

41 And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art ^acareful and troubled about many things:

42 But one thing is needful: and Mary hath ^achosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

CHAPTER 11

Jesus gives the Lord's Prayer—He discusses the casting out of devils—He acclaims Himself as greater than Jonah and Solomon—He rebukes the Pharisees and says that the blood of all the prophets may be required of their generation.

AND it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, ateach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.

2 And he said unto them, When ye pray, say, Our ^aFather which art in

heaven, Hallowed be thy ^bname. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth.

3 Give us day by day our daily bread.

4 And ^aforgive us our sins; for we also forgive every one that is ^bindebted to us. ^cAnd lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

5 ^aAnd he said unto them, Which of you shall have a friend, and shall go unto him at midnight, and say unto him, Friend, lend me three loaves;

6 For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him?

7 And he from within shall answer and say, Trouble me not: the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give thee.

8 I say unto you, Though he will not rise and give him, because he is his ^afriend, yet because of his importunity he will rise and give him as many as he needeth.

9 And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you.

10 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

11 If a son shall ask bread of any of you that is a father, will he give him a stone? or if *he ask* a fish, will he for a fish give him a serpent?

12 Or if he shall ask an egg, will he offer him a scorpion?

13 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children:

how much more shall *your* heavenly Father give ^athe Holy Spirit to them that ask him?

14 ¶ And he was casting ^aout a devil, and it was dumb. And it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake; and the people wondered.

15 But some of them said, He casteth out devils through ^aBeelzebub the chief of the devils.

16 And others, tempting him, sought of him a asign from heaven.

17 But he, knowing their athoughts, said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.

18 If Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because ye say that I cast out devils through Beelzebub.

19 And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your sons ^acast them out? therefore shall they be your judges.

20 But if I with the ^afinger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you.

21 When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace:

22 But when a stronger than he shall come upon him, and overcome him, he taketh from him all his armour wherein he trusted, and divideth his spoils.

23 He that is not with me is ^aagainst me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.

The friend to whom the host of the traveler goes for bread represents our Father in Heaven. The parable teaches that persistent, righteous, and faithful prayers to our Father open the doors of heaven because of His overwhelming goodness and His love and concern for His children. The Joseph Smith Translation adds an introduction to the parable that helps make this clear: "Your heavenly Father will not fail to give unto you whatsoever ye ask of him" (Joseph Smith Translation, Luke 11:5 [in Luke 11:5, footnote a]).

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27 ¶ And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, ^aBlessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked.

28 But he said, Yea rather, ^ablessed are they that hear the word of God, and bkeep it.

29 ¶ And when the people were gathered thick together, he began to say, This is an evil generation: they seek a asign; and there shall no sign be given it, but the sign of Jonas the prophet.

33 No man, when he hath lighted a ^acandle, putteth it in a secret place,

neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light.

34 The light of the body is the ^aeye: therefore when thine eye is ^bsingle, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of cdarkness.

35 Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.

36 If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light.

37 ¶ And as he spake, a certain Pharisee besought him to dine with him: and he went in, and sat down to meat.

38 And when the Pharisee saw it, he marvelled that he had not first washed before dinner.

39 And the Lord said unto him, Now do ye Pharisees make ^aclean the outside of the cup and the platter; but your binward part is full of ^cravening and ^dwickedness.

40 Ye fools, did not he that made that which is without make that which is within also?

41 ^aBut rather ^bgive ^calms of such things as ye have; and, behold, all things are ^dclean unto you.

42 But woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass over judgment and the alove of God: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.
