The phrase "gathered to his people" is one more evidence of their gospel knowledge. Two Bible scholars commented on the significance of that phrase: "This expression ... denotes the reunion in Sheol [shee-OLE] with friends who have gone before, and therefore presupposes faith in the personal continuance of a man after death, as a presentiment which the promises of God had exalted in the case of the patriarchs into a firm assurance of faith [see Hebrews 11:13]" (Keil and Delitzsch, Commentary, 1:1:263). Sheol is the Hebrew word for the world of spirits where one goes when one dies, the equivalent of the spirit world. The Hebrews had not only a concept of life after death but also a correct concept of the intermediate place between death and the Resurrection.



Esau's words "I am at the point to die" were likely an exaggeration and a rationalization for his actions. "Jacob would almost certainly have succored Esau freely if his life were in jeopardy.
