Old Testament Seminary Manual

The book of Deuteronomy contains Moses's final words to the children of Israel before they entered the land of Canaan with Joshua as their leader. The book's title means "second law" or "repetition of the law" (see Bible Dictionary, "Deuteronomy"), for in these final sermons, Moses repeated to the Israelites many of the laws and commandments that were part of their covenant with the Lord. Moses also exhorted the Israelites to remember and keep their covenant as he taught them the consequences of either obeying or disobeying the Lord's laws and commandments. As students study Deuteronomy, they will learn the importance of looking to past spiritual experiences and remembering to keep the laws, covenants, and commandments of the Lord so that they can have the same promises of prosperity and protection as ancient Israel.

The book of Deuteronomy contains Moses's three great final sermons to the children of Israel. "The first discourse is found in Deut. 1-4 and is introductory. The second discourse (Deut. 5–26) consists of two parts: (1) 5-11, the Ten Commandments and a practical exposition of them, (2) 12-26, a code of laws, which forms the nucleus of the whole book. ... The third discourse (Deut. 27–30) contains a solemn renewal of the covenant [between God and Israel] and an announcement of the blessings of obedience and the curses upon disobedience" (Bible Dictionary, "Deuteronomy"). These sermons contain Moses's heartfelt pleas for the Israelites to remember the Lord and live His laws in the promised land. The instructions recorded in Deuteronomy were specifically directed to a new generation whose parents had died in the wilderness following their rebellion (see Numbers 14:26-33; 26:63-65).

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
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Based on Moses's instructions in verses 8-9, the Jews developed customs involving the Shema, the mezuzah, and tefillin (or phylacteries). The Shema refers to several scripture passages, including Deuteronomy 6:4-9, that are recited daily by devout Jews. Many Jews write these same passages on a small piece of parchment and place the parchment in a small container called a mezuzah (the Hebrew word for doorpost), which is then placed on the right side of the doorframe of their homes. Tefillin are small, square leather boxes worn over the forehead and on the inside of the biceps of the non-dominant arm. These boxes contain pieces of parchment with scriptures from the Shema.

CHAPTER 9

Other nations are driven out of Canaan because of their wickedness—Moses rehearses the rebellions of Israel and tells how he mediated between the people and the Lord—On two occasions he went without food and water for forty days.

HEAR, O Israel: Thou art to pass over Jordan this day, to go in to apossess nations greater and mightier than thyself, cities great and ^bfenced up to heaven,



"At least four other scriptures refer to the prophet like unto Moses (see Acts 3:22–23; 1 Nephi 22:21; 3 Nephi 20:23; JS—H 1:40). In each instance these scriptures make it clear that the prophet like unto Moses was the Savior, Jesus Christ. When Jesus visited the Nephites, as recorded in the Book of Mormon, He identified Himself in this way:

"Behold, I am he of whom Moses spake, saying: A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear in all things whatsoever he shall say unto you. And it shall come to pass that every soul who will not hear that prophet shall be cut off from among the people.' (3 Nephi 20:23.)"

To prepare the Israelites to go forth to conquer the promised land, the Lord told them, "Fear not, ... for the Lord your God ... goeth with you, to fight for you against your enemies" (verses 3–4). The Lord instructed the Israelite armies to first offer each city in the border areas a proclamation of peace in order to give the city's inhabitants a chance to surrender (see verses 10–11). If this offer was rejected, the Israelite armies were to "besiege," or surround, the city. When the city fell, the men were to be killed, but the women, children, and flocks were to be preserved (see verses 12–14).

Deuteronomy 20:16–18

16 But of the cities of these people, which the Lord thy God doth give thee for an inheritance, thou shalt save alive nothing that breatheth:

17 But thou shalt utterly destroy them; namely, the Hittites, and the Amorites, the Canaanites, and the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites; as the Lord thy God hath commanded thee:

18 That they teach you not to do after all their abominations, which they have done unto their gods; so should ye sin against the Lord your God.



66 And thy life shall hang in adoubt before thee; and thou shalt fear day and night, and shalt have none assurance of thy life:

67 In the morning thou shalt say, Would God it were even! and at even thou shalt say, Would God it were morning! for the fear of thine heart wherewith thou shalt fear, and for the sight of thine eyes which thou shalt see.

68 And the LORD shall bring thee ainto Egypt again with ships, by the way whereof I spake unto thee, Thou shalt see it no more again: and there ye shall be sold unto your enemies for bondmen and bondwomen, and no man shall buy you.

CHAPTER 29

The children of Israel make a covenant with the Lord under which they will be blessed if they are obedient, and cursed if they are disobedient—If they are disobedient, their land will be as brimstone and salt.

THESE *are* the words of the ^acovenant, which the LORD commanded Moses to make with the children of Israel in the land of Moab, beside the covenant which he made with them in Horeb.

2 ¶ And Moses called unto all Israel, and said unto them, Ye have seen all that the LORD did before your eyes in the land of Egypt unto Pharaoh, and unto all his servants, and unto all his land;

3 The great ^atemptations which thine eyes have seen, the signs, and those great ^bmiracles:

4 Yet the LORD hath not given you an heart to perceive, and eyes to see, and ears to hear, unto this day.

5 And I have led you forty years in the wilderness: your clothes are not ^awaxen old upon you, and thy shoe is not waxen old upon thy foot.

6 Ye have not eaten bread, neither have ye drunk wine or strong drink: that ye might know that I *am* the LORD your God.

7 And when ye came unto this place, ^aSihon the king of Heshbon, and Og the king of Bashan, came out against us unto battle, and we ^bsmote them:

8 And we took their land, and gave it for an inheritance unto the Reubenites, and to the Gadites, and to the half tribe of Manasseh.

9 Keep therefore the words of this covenant, and do them, that ye may ^aprosper in all that ye do.

10 ¶ Ye stand this day all of you before the LORD your God; your captains of your tribes, your elders, and your officers, with all the men of Israel,

11 Your little ones, your wives, and thy stranger that *is* in thy camp, from the ^ahewer of thy wood unto the drawer of thy water:

12 That thou shouldest enter into ^acovenant with the LORD thy God, and into his ^boath, which the LORD thy God maketh with thee this day:

13 That he may establish thee to day for a people unto himself, and that he may be unto thee a ^aGod, as he hath said unto thee, and as he hath sworn unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob.

14 Neither with you only do I make this covenant and this oath;

15 But with him that standeth here with us this day before the LORD our God, and also with him that is not here with us this day:

16 (For ye know how we have dwelt in the land of Egypt; and how we came through the nations which ye passed by;

23 And that the whole land thereof is abrimstone, and bsalt, and burning, that it is not sown, nor beareth, nor any grass groweth therein, like the overthrow of Sodom, and Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboim, which the LORD overthrew in his anger, and in his wrath:

24 Even all nations shall say, ^aWherefore hath the LORD ^bdone thus unto this land? what *meaneth* the heat of this great anger?

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

Unicorn

Deuteronomy 33:17: "His glory is like the firstling of his bullock, and his horns are like the horns of unicorns".

Footnote 17b, it explains that "unicorn" might more accurately be translated as "wild ox".

Unicorn appears a total of 9 times in the Old Testament.

In the Hebrew it refers to a species of wild ox called, bos primigenius in Latin (BD). It's now extinct, but was evidently common in Syria. It had two horns.

Most modern English translations use "wild ox", instead of "unicorn."

"The Old Testament account that Moses died and was buried by the hand of the Lord in an unknown grave is an error. (Deut. 34:5-7.) It is true that he may have been 'buried by the hand of the Lord,' if that expression is a figure of speech which means that he was translated. But the Book of Mormon account, in recording that Alma 'was taken up by the Spirit,' says, 'the scriptures saith the Lord took Moses unto himself; and we suppose that he has also received Alma in the spirit, unto himself.' (Alma 45:18-19.) It should be remembered that the Nephites had the Brass Plates, and that they were the 'scriptures' which gave the account of Moses being taken by way of translation."
