## Psalms 103-106

These Psalms summarize God's dealings with his people before any kings reigned. The standard Hebrew text of the psalms divides them into 5 "books," perhaps in imitation of the five books of Moses. The psalm that ends the book finishes with an expression of praise (otherwise known as a doxology). Book 4 ends with 106:47-48



## Psalm 106:47-48

47 Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the heathen, to give thanks unto thy holy name, and to triumph in thy praise.
48 Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting to everlasting: and let all the people say, Amen. Praise ye the Lord.



### Psalms 107-150

Book 5 of the Psalms (107-150) reflects the closing petition of the previous collection in 106:47. It declares that God does answer prayer (107) and concludes with 5 Hallelujah Psalms (146-150). In between there are several Psalms affirming the validity of the promises to David (Psalms 110; 132; 144), two collections of Davidic Psalms (108-110; 138-145); the longest Psalm, celebrating the value of the law (Psalm 119); and 15 Psalms of ascent for use by pilgrims to Jerusalem (Psalms 120-134).

38 And shed innocent <sup>*a*</sup>blood, even the blood of their sons and of their daughters, whom they sacrificed unto the <sup>*b*</sup>idols of Canaan: and the land was polluted with blood.

39 Thus were they defiled with their own works, and went a whoring with their own inventions.

40 Therefore was the <sup>*a*</sup>wrath of the LORD kindled against his people, insomuch that he abhorred his own inheritance.

41 And he gave them into the hand of the heathen; and they that hated them ruled over them.

42 Their <sup>*a*</sup> enemies also <sup>*b*</sup> oppressed them, and they were brought into subjection under their hand.

43 Many times did he deliver them; but they provoked *him* with their counsel, and were brought low for their iniquity.

44 Nevertheless he regarded their affliction, when he heard their cry:

45 And he remembered for them his <sup>*a*</sup> covenant, and <sup>*b*</sup> repented according to the multitude of his mercies.

46 He made them also to be pitied of all those that carried them captives.

47 Save us, O LORD our God, and gather us from among the heathen, to give thanks unto thy holy name, *and* to triumph in thy praise.

48 <sup>*a*</sup>Blessed *be* the LORD God of Israel from everlasting to everlasting: and let all the people say, Amen. Praise ye the LORD.

### **PSALM 107**

The people of Israel are to praise and thank the Lord when they are gathered and redeemed—Oh, that men would praise the Lord!—The Lord's providences prevail in the lives of men.

O GIVE thanks unto the LORD, for *he is* good: for his mercy *endureth* for ever.

2 Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, whom he hath <sup>*a*</sup>redeemed from the hand of the enemy;

3 And gathered them out of the lands, from the east, and from the west, from the north, and from the south.

4 They <sup>*a*</sup>wandered in the <sup>*b*</sup>wilderness in a solitary way; they found no city to dwell in.

5 Hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted in them.

6 Then they <sup>*a*</sup>cried unto the LORD in their <sup>*b*</sup>trouble, *and* he delivered them out of their distresses.

7 And he led them forth by the right way, that they might go to a city of habitation.

8 Oh that *men* would praise the LORD *for* his goodness, and *for* his wonderful works to the children of men!

9 For he satisfieth the longing soul, and filleth the hungry soul with goodness.

10 Such as sit in <sup>*a*</sup>darkness and in the shadow of death, *being* bound in affliction and iron;

11 Because they <sup>*a*</sup> rebelled against the words of God, and contemned the counsel of the most High:

12 Therefore he brought down their heart with labour; they fell down, and *there was* none to help.

13 Then they cried unto the LORD in their trouble, *and* he saved them out of their distresses.

14 He brought them out of darkness and the <sup>*a*</sup>shadow of death, and brake their bands in sunder.

15 Oh that *men* would praise the LORD *for* his goodness, and *for* his wonderful works to the children of men!

16 For he hath <sup>*a*</sup>broken the gates of brass, and cut the bars of iron in sunder.

17 Fools because of their transgression, and because of their iniquities, are afflicted.

18 Their soul abhorreth all manner of a meat; and they draw near unto the gates of death.

19 Then they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, *and* he saveth them out of their distresses.

20 He sent his word, and healed them, and delivered *them* from their destructions.

21 Oh that *men* would praise the LORD *for* his goodness, and *for* his wonderful works to the children of men!

22 And let them sacrifice the sacrifices of <sup>*a*</sup>thanksgiving, and declare his works with <sup>*b*</sup>rejoicing.

23 They that go down to the sea in ships, that do business in great waters;

24 These see the works of the LORD, and his wonders in the deep.

25 For he commandeth, and raiseth

the stormy wind, which lifteth up the waves thereof.

26 They mount up to the heaven, they go down again to the depths: their soul is melted because of trouble.

27 They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken <sup>*a*</sup>man, and are at their wits' end.

28 Then they cry unto the LORD in their trouble, and he bringeth them out of their distresses.

29 He <sup>*a*</sup>maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still.

30 Then are they glad because they be quiet; so he bringeth them unto their desired haven.

31 Oh that *men* would praise the LORD *for* his goodness, and *for* his wonderful works to the children of men!

32 Let them exalt him also in the <sup>*a*</sup> congregation of the people, and praise him in the assembly of the elders.

33 He turneth rivers into a wilderness, and the watersprings into dry ground;

34 Å fruitful land into barrenness, for the <sup>*a*</sup>wickedness of them that dwell therein.

35 He turneth the <sup>*a*</sup>wilderness into a standing water, and dry ground into watersprings.

36 And there he maketh the hungry to dwell, that they may prepare a city for habitation;

37 And sow the fields, and plant vineyards, which may yield fruits of increase.

38 He blesseth them also, so that they are multiplied greatly; and suffereth not their cattle to decrease.

39 Again, they are <sup>*a*</sup>minished and brought low through oppression, affliction, and sorrow.

40 He poureth contempt upon princes, and causeth them to wander in the wilderness, where there is no way.

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

25 I became also a reproach unto them: when they looked upon me they shaked their heads.

26 Help me, O LORD my God: O save me according to thy mercy: 27 That they may know that this is thy hand; that thou, LORD, hast done it.

28 Let them <sup>*a*</sup>curse, but bless thou: when they arise, let them be ashamed; but let thy servant rejoice.
