



Old Testament Seminary Manual

Haggai was a prophet who lived in Jerusalem not long after the Jews returned from the Babylonian exile (see Bible Dictionary, "Haggai"). It is presumed that he is the author of the book bearing his name. Haggai spoke the prophecies contained in his book around 520 B.C. in Jerusalem (see Bible Dictionary, "Haggai"). If Haggai wrote this book, he most likely wrote it in Jerusalem as well.

The book of Haggai provides helpful insights concerning the rebuilding of the temple in Jerusalem. After the Jews returned to Jerusalem from Babylon, they began to rebuild the city and the temple but stopped when they encountered opposition (see Ezra 1–4). The book of Haggai records the Lord's commandment to the Jews to renew their efforts in rebuilding the temple. The Jews obeyed the word of the Lord through Haggai and succeeded in completing the temple (see Haggai 1–2; Ezra 5–6).

CHAPTER 1

Haggai exhorts the people to build the temple.

In the second year of Darius the king, in the sixth bmonth, in the first day of the month, came the word of the LORD by Haggai the prophet unto cZerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Josedech, the high priest, saying,

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

This prophecy could refer to the Savior's visits to the temple during His mortal ministry. It could also refer to His visit to His temple in Jerusalem at the Second Coming, which may be what Haggai meant when he said, "The glory of this latter house shall be greater than of the former," or Solomon's temple (verse 9).



The prophet Zechariah was the son of Berechiah, who was the son of Iddo (see Zechariah 1:1). Iddo was a priest who returned to Jerusalem with Zerubbabel, the first Jewish governor of Jerusalem after the Jews' return from the Babylonian exile (see Nehemiah 12:1–7). Zechariah prophesied from the second to the fourth year of the reign of Darius, about 520 to 518 B.C. (see Zechariah 1:1; 7:1). Along with his contemporary Haggai, Zechariah was instrumental in organizing and inspiring the Jews to finish rebuilding the temple (see Ezra 5:1; 6:14).

Many of the messages Zechariah received from the Lord were in the form of visions (see Zechariah 1–6). Possibly because of the difficulty of conveying heavenly visions in earthly terms, most of the messages in the book of Zechariah are couched in symbolic imagery and descriptions.


The book is generally divided by its readers into two divisions: "Zech. 1–8, a series of visions sketching the future of the people of God, and Zech. 9–14, prophecies about the Messiah and events preceding His Second Coming" (Bible Dictionary, "Zechariah"). Of particular significance are the vivid prophecies of Christ's earthly ministry (see Zechariah 9:9; 11:10–13) and of such latter-day events as the gathering of Israel, the final great battle, and the Second Coming (see Zechariah 10:6–12; 12:2–14; 14:1–9).

Zechariah Visions

- A vision of horses (see Zechariah 1:7–17), which teaches about the merciful way the Lord will deal with Jerusalem
- A vision of four horns and four carpenters (see Zechariah 1:18-21), which is about the powers (horns) that scattered Judah and what will happen to these powers
- A vision of the man with a measuring line (a surveyor; see Zechariah 2),
 which testifies of the Lord's protective power over His people
- A vision of the high priest (see Zechariah 3), which symbolizes how Judah can overcome Satan and be cleansed through the power of Jesus Christ ("the Branch" in v. 8)

Zechariah Visions

- A vision of a lampstand and olive trees (see Zechariah 4), which symbolizes how the Lord would give power to His people by His Holy Spirit
- A vision of a flying scroll (see Zechariah 5:1–4), which taught that those
 who were dishonest in the land were condemned
- A vision of a woman in a basket (see Zechariah 5:5–11), which testifies that wickedness would be removed from the people
- A vision of four chariots (see Zechariah 6:1-8), which symbolizes spreading the Lord's power over the whole earth

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



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

Zechariah 10-11

This prophecy refers to the Apostle Judas's betrayal of Jesus for 30 pieces of silver during the final week of the Savior's mortal life (see Matthew 26:14–16). Zechariah also saw that as part of this betrayal, Jesus Christ would be smitten and His followers would be scattered (see Zechariah 13:7; Matthew 26:31).

14 All the families that remain, every family apart, and their wives apart.

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CHAPTER 13

In that day there shall be a ^afountain opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for uncleanness.

2 ¶ And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the LORD of hosts, that I will cut off the names of the aidols out of the land, and they shall no more be remembered: and also I will cause the prophets and the unclean spirit to pass out of the land.

3 And it shall come to pass, that when any shall yet prophesy, then his father and his mother that be-

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3 And it shall come to pass, that when any shall yet prophesy, then his father and his mother that begat him shall say unto him, Thou shalt not live; for thou speakest lies in the name of the LORD: and his father and his mother that begat him shall thrust him through when he prophesieth.

4 And it shall come to pass in that day, that the prophets shall be ^aashamed every one of his vision, when he hath prophesied; neither shall they wear a brough garment to deceive:

5 But he shall say, I am no prophet, I am an husbandman; for man taught me to keep cattle from my youth.

6 And one shall say unto him, What are these awounds in thine hands? Then he shall answer, Those with which I was bwounded in the house of my friends.

7 ¶ Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, and against the man athat is my fellow, saith the LORD of

hosts: smite the bshepherd, and the ^csheep shall be ^dscattered: and I will turn mine hand upon the little ones.

8 And it shall come to pass, that in all the land, saith the LORD, two parts therein shall be cut off and die; but the third shall be aleft therein.

9 And I will bring the third part through the fire, and will arefine them as silver is refined, and will btry them as gold is ctried: they shall call on my name, and I will hear them: I will say, It is my dpeople: and they shall say, The LORD is my God.

CHAPTER 14

At His Second Coming, the Lord will fight for Israel—His feet will stand upon the Mount of Olives—He will be King over all the earth—Plagues will destroy the wicked.

BEHOLD, the aday of the LORD cometh, and thy spoil shall be divided in the midst of thee.

2 For I will gather all nations against Jerusalem to abattle; and the city shall be taken, and the bhouses rifled, and the women ravished; and half of the city shall go forth into captivity, and the residue of the people shall not be cut off from the city.

3 Then shall the LORD go forth, and a fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle.

4 ¶ And his afeet shall bstand in that day upon the ^cmount of Olives, which is before Jerusalem on the east, and the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east and toward the west, and

there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it toward the south.

5 And ye shall flee to the valley of the mountains; for the valley of the mountains shall reach unto Azal: yea, ye shall flee, like as ye fled from before the aearthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah: and the LORD my God shall come, and all the bsaints with thee.

6 And it shall come to pass in that day, that the alight shall not be clear, nor dark:

7 But it shall be one day which shall be known to the LORD, not day, nor night: but it shall come to pass, that at evening time it shall be light.

8 And it shall be in that day, that ^aliving ^bwaters shall go out from Jerusalem; half of them toward the former sea, and half of them toward the hinder sea: in summer and in winter shall it be.

9 And the LORD shall be aking over all the earth: in that day shall there be one LORD, and his name one.

10 All the land shall be turned as a ^aplain from Geba to Rimmon south of Jerusalem: and bit shall be lifted up, and inhabited in her cplace, from Benjamin's gate unto the place of the first gate, unto the corner gate, and from the tower of Hananeel unto the king's winepresses.

11 And men shall dwell in it, and there shall be no more utter destruction; but Jerusalem shall be safely inhabited.


